2020/062 Declarations of Interes

2020/063 Meeting adjourned for members of the public to address the council on matters related to this agenda.

2020/064 Minutes from the planning meeting held 3rd September 2020 having been circulated separately to be approved. The minutes will be signed by the chairman at the earliest convenience.

Outstanding Issues/Updates

- Village Design Statement (minute ref: 19/158): Work on the VDS is deferred until further notice.
- Village Pavements: Request for path clearance and siding out through villages. As NCC have declined to fund this project, the council considered funding the siding out from reserves. Council will assess the areas that need work before seeking a quote. Clerk will forward a map to councillors.
- Verge maintenance nr Farmdale House (minute ref: 19/124): NCC have issued a private licence to Mr Cutler allowing him to establish a wild flower area. FOI request has been sent to NCC. NCC have answered the FOI request stating that no licence exists. Clerk to investigate.
- Brampton Valley Caravans: DDC Planning Enforcement Officer has been notified. Awaiting response.
- Boughton Mill footpath diversion: NCC are aware that the path has been diverted without authorisation. CCB PC will establish what signage has been erected and confirm that a footpath is accessible.
- Trees on Harlestone Road (adjacent to May Trees, Golf Lane). NCC have confirmed that these trees belong to residents at May Trees. As there is no imminent highway health & safety threat NCC will not take action to remove or prune the trees. Mrs King has been notified.
- "Althorp" Oak Tree. Cllr SC will supply the replacement tree.
- Althorp Tree Works (roadside felling & pruning). Nigel shields confirmed trees are felled one year and replaced the next where possible... where possible means that they do not replace trees that were closer than 12 feet to the highway as per NCC highways advice.
- Tree on A5199 has been rather brutally pruned. Cllr JS to report back to council.

2020/065 Environment (verges/paths/trees)

- Works to hedge along Harlestone Road (adjacent to Spencer Close): Quote from Guy Robins: Cut and Lay/ tidy up approx. 43 metres of hedge along Harlestone Road. Remove brambles and dead material, plant up gaps with mixed native species and cut and lay hedge in both directions over new plants and secure with stakes and binders. Either remove all brash from site or chip on site and spread chippings under hedge

Materials: £510.00 Labour: £600.00 Total = £1,110.00

2020/066 Street Lighting

2020/068 Playing Field & Pocket Park

- Update on DDC grant application
- Works to southern boundary of Playing Field. The council is asked to review the quotes from Guy Robins: Plant approx.. 180 Metres of New Hedge along Southern boundary of Chapel Brampton Playing Field using a mixed Native species (60% Hawthorn and 5% of each of the following Field Maple, Blackthorn, Hazel, Crab Apple, Dog Rose, Wayfaring Tree, Guelder Rose).

Plant Height would be 60/80 cm and planted in a double row at a spacing of five plants per metre protected by Spiral Shelters and supported by canes, existing trees and plants would be kept in the hedgerow, bare rooted plants will be available to transplant from early November

Materials: £1,114.20 Labour: £750.00 Total = £1,864.20 (exc. VAT)

- Tree work in Playing Field. The council is asked to review the quote from Maurice Fitch:
 - 1. Cutdown dead tree by entrance
 - 2. Raise canopy on mature Oak,
 - 3. Remove Blackthorn thicket and grind roots
 - 4. Raise canopy on Ash
 - 5. Remove Elderberry
 - 6. Raise canopy on Oaks x 3
 - 7. Remove dead Thorn
 - 8. Cut back the side of the bottom boundary and poison the roots.

Remove all debris Total Cost: £1,180.00
